E-Rate Application Cycle FY 2010: Reminders

The FY2010 Form 471 application filing window opened at noon EST on **Thursday, December 3, 2009** and will close at 11:59 pm EST on **Thursday, February 11, 2010**. We want to remind you of important program deadlines and other information you should keep in mind as you apply for discounts.

File early. Do not wait until the last minute.

File online. The [online filing system](#) alerts applicants to common errors or possible inconsistencies in the data they provide as they are filling out their forms. Make sure to temporarily allow pop-ups in your Internet browser when you are filing online, as many of these built-in reminders and error messages occur via pop-ups. The application number and security code will be assigned to you after you complete Block 1 of the form online. **Save it!**

Arizona State Master Contracts are valid for the full year 2010-11. Check www.lib.az.us/erate Please be sure that when you use the State Master Contracts, you do a Mini bid and select your vendor. Sign your contracts before filing the Form 471. You can always submit your item 21 after the filing deadline, if it is not ready.
