The State Library pays for membership in the Collaborative Summer Library Program (CSLP) for all AZ libraries, and there are new online resources for summer reading added all the time to their website at www.csllpreads.org. Any librarian in the state can set up an account to access the information for members available through the website. Examples of the resources are a new early literacy manual, designed with ages 0-5 in mind, and video of finger plays being signed.
