The Arizona Capitol Museum offers education and enjoyment for all of our guests. It is housed in this modest, four-floor stone structure with the distinctive copper dome, originally the capitol of the Arizona Territory and the State of Arizona.

The State Legislature designated the 1901 Statehouse as a museum in 1977. The building is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



Under the Copper Dome, The Arizona Capitol, 1898-1974, a fascinating history of the building, is available in the Capitol Museum Store, on the first floor.

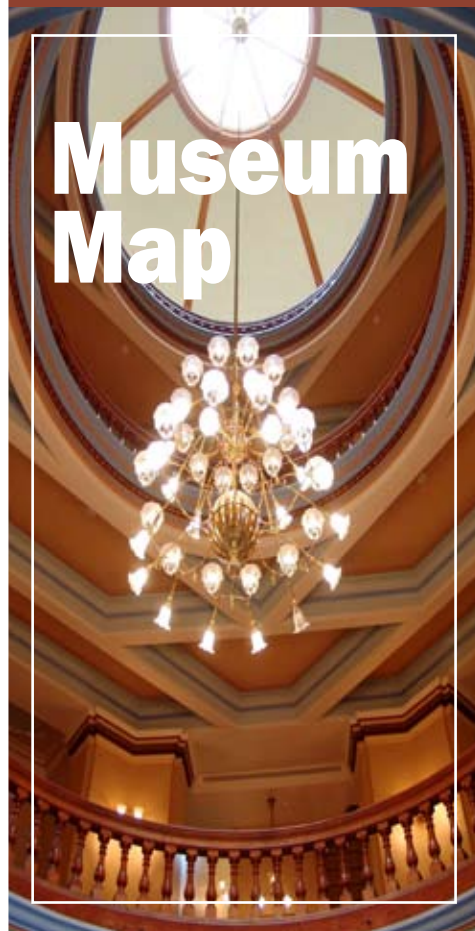

Museum Map

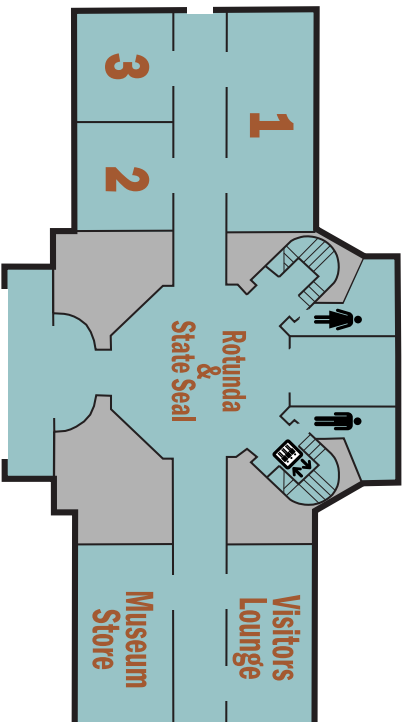

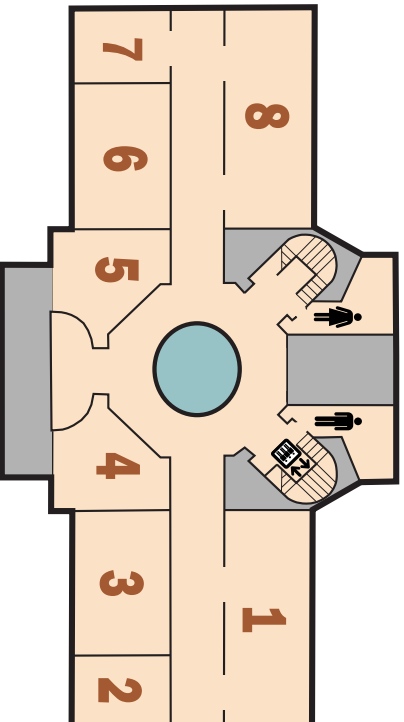

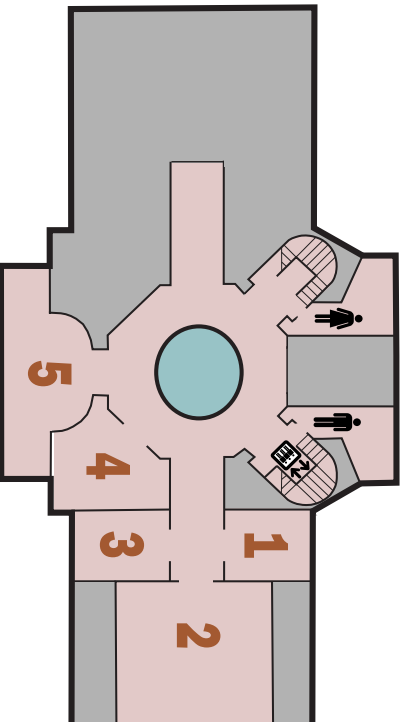
